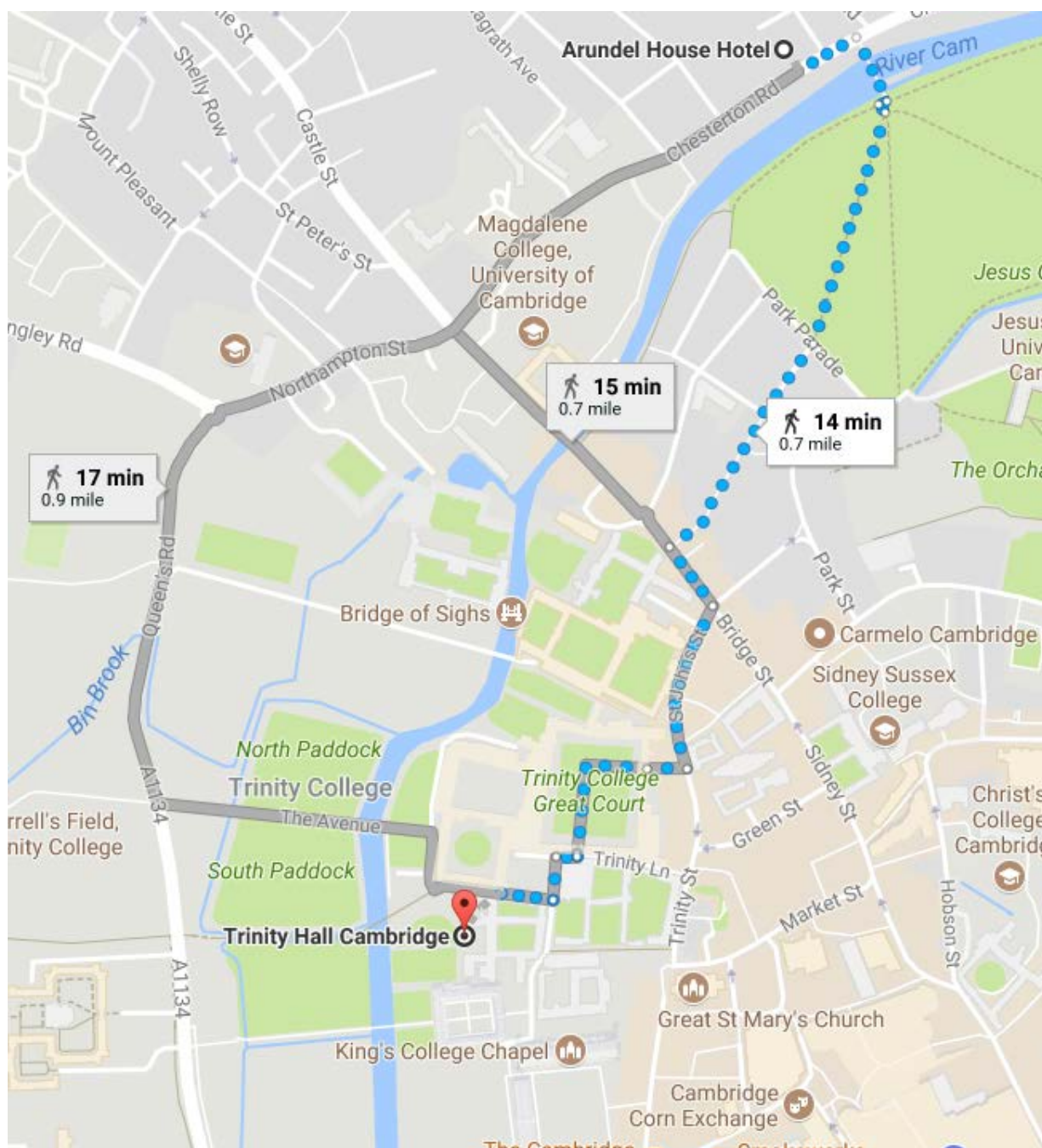
Conference Dinner - Monday 10 July

There are no car parking facilities at the Trinity Hall Central Site.

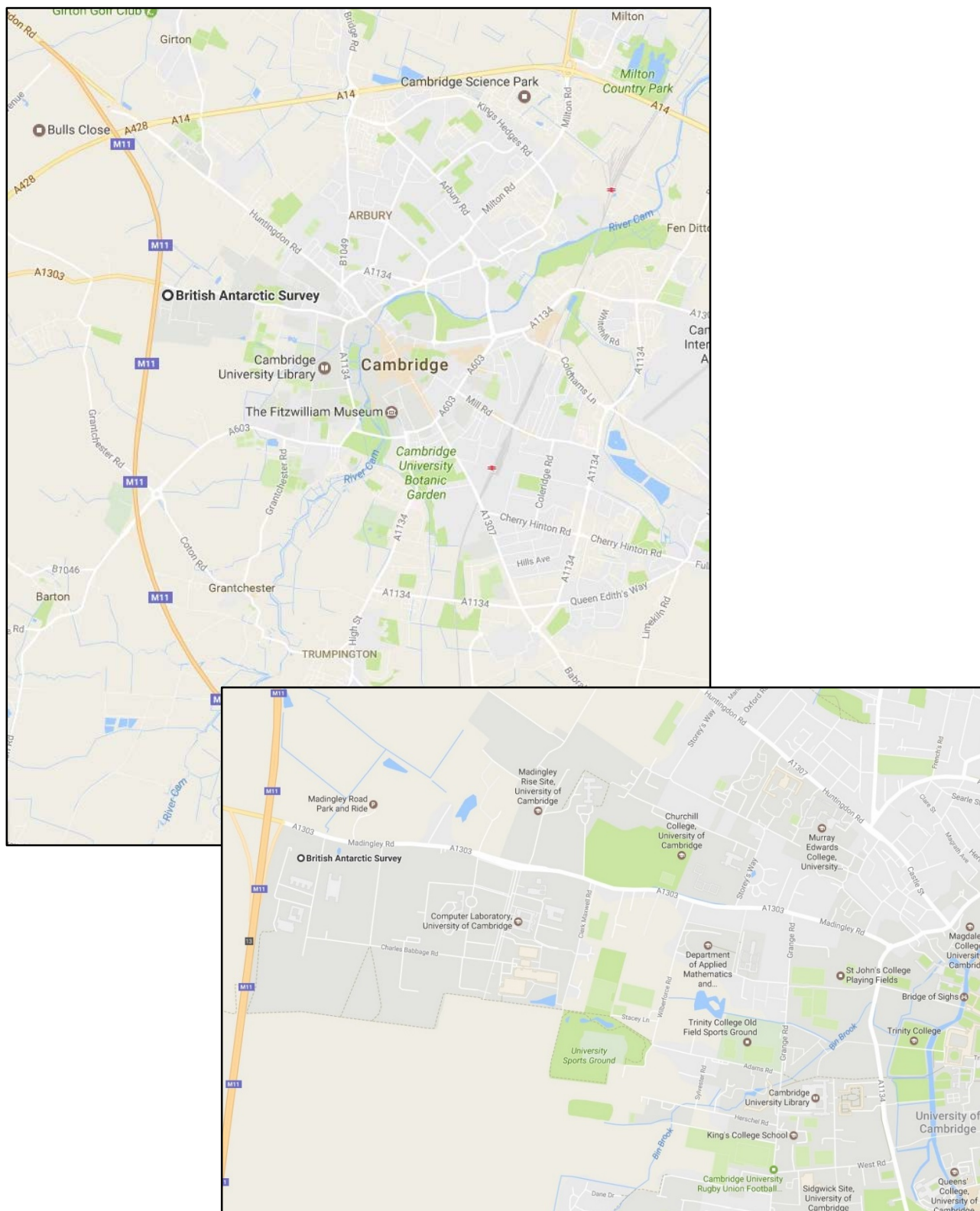

Travelling to BAS by train

The nearest rail station is Cambridge. There are direct trains from London (King's Cross Station and Liverpool Street Station) which take about one hour; and London Stansted Airport which take about 35 minutes. For those arriving in London by Eurostar train services, the Eurostar terminal at London St Pancras International is five minutes' walk from Kings Cross Station.

There is a taxi rank immediately outside Cambridge rail station. A taxi from the station to BAS costs around £8 - £10. There is also a Cycle Hire shop in the railway station car park.

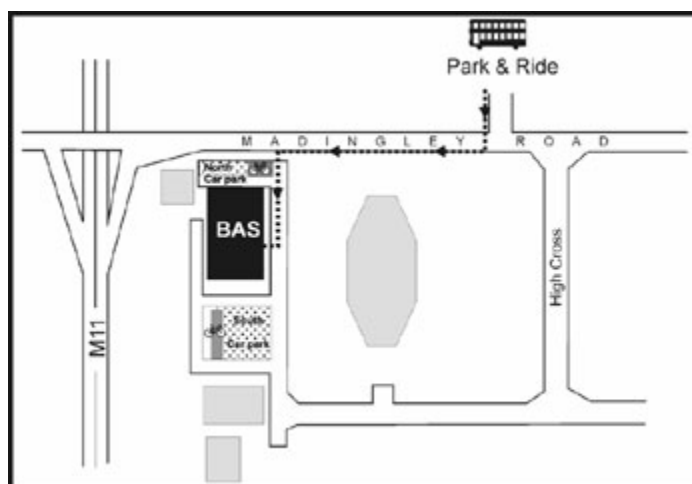
Travelling to BAS by bus (from the railway station)

To the city centre:

- Universal Bus - this is the only direct bus from the railway station to West Cambridge/Madingley Road Park & Ride. It leaves every fifteen minutes from Stop 8 just outside the station. It is run by Whippet - currently a day ticket is £3, one journey £2 or a weekly pass is £10.
- The Citi 1, Citi 3, Citi 7 and Citi 8 bus services run frequently between the rail station and the city centre. All buses to the city centre go from the bus stops on the road to the left as you come out of the rail station - turn left as you leave the station, cross on the zebra crossing and turn left again. All stops on this side of the road go through Cambridge City Centre.
- If you travel to the City Centre, you will need to catch the Madingley Road Park & Ride bus from stop S3 right outside the Grand Arcade. A return ticket will cost you £3.
- The city centre bus station is on Drummer Street. Most bus services will stop here. The No 4 bus to Camborne leaves from Stop D3 on Emanuel Street – this bus departs every 20 minutes and stops very close to BAS on Madingley Road. A Day Rider ticket allowing unlimited travel within the city on all buses for one day currently costs £4.10, and a Mega Rider 7 day ticket costs £14.

To BAS:

The Madingley Road Park and Ride bus station is directly across the road from the British Antarctic Survey and buses run every 10 minutes between here and the city centre. As you leave the Park and Ride entrance on the right hand side, on foot, turn right onto Madingley Road, cross over the road and walk until you reach a gap in the fence directly by the No 4 bus stop, then walk directly ahead until you reach the BAS Entrance and Reception to your right - approximately in the centre of the east face of the building. Walking to BAS from the Park & Ride bus terminal:





Driving to BAS in Cambridge - Directions from the M11 and A14

From the south and from London via the M11:

- Leave the M11 at Junction 13 (signposted Cambridge/A1303/Bedford/A428)
- Turn right onto the A1303/Madingley Road (signposted Cambridge A1303)
- Turn right onto High Cross (signposted High Cross)
- Turn right at T junction (onto Charles Babbage Road - not signposted)
- Turn right
- Please follow signs for parking at BAS, and proceed on foot to BAS Reception.

From the north, east and west via the A14:

(The M1, A1, A1(M) and M6 all link to the A14 dual carriageway)

- Leave the A14 at junction 31 and join the A1307/Huntingdon Road (signposted A1307/Cambridge)
- At traffic signals, get into the right hand lane (signposted Ring Road Newnham, Trumpington...) and continue forward onto the A1134/Castle Street
- At traffic signals, stay in the right hand lane (signposted Ring Road) and turn right onto the A1134/Mount Pleasant
- Bear left onto Shelly Row (following the one-way system)
- Bear right onto Albion Row (signposted Ring Road)
- Continue forward onto Lady Margaret Road
- At traffic signals get into the right hand lane and turn right onto the A1303/Madingley Road (signposted London (M11), Bedford...)
- Turn left onto High Cross (signposted High Cross)
- Turn right at T junction (onto Charles Babbage Road - not signposted)
- Turn right.

Please follow signs for parking at BAS, and proceed on foot to BAS Reception.

From north, east and west via the M11 (avoiding city centre traffic):

To avoid city centre traffic, you can use the M11 to get to BAS, which is just east of Junction 13. You can get to the M11 southbound from the A14. However, there is no southbound exit at Junction 13 of the M11. Instead, you will need to:

- Leave the M11 at Junction 12
- At the roundabout take the 3rd exit onto A603/Barton Road
- At the roundabout, take the 2nd exit to rejoin the M11 northbound (signposted A14/A10/Huntingdon)
- Leave the M11 again at Junction 13 (signposted Cambridge/A1303/Bedford/A428)
- Turn right onto the A1303/Madingley Road (signposted Cambridge A1303)
- Turn right onto High Cross (signposted High Cross)
- Turn right at T junction (onto Charles Babbage Road - not signposted)
- Turn right
- Please follow signs for parking at BAS, and proceed on foot to BAS Reception.



Travelling to BAS by air

Cambridge is served by three major airports:

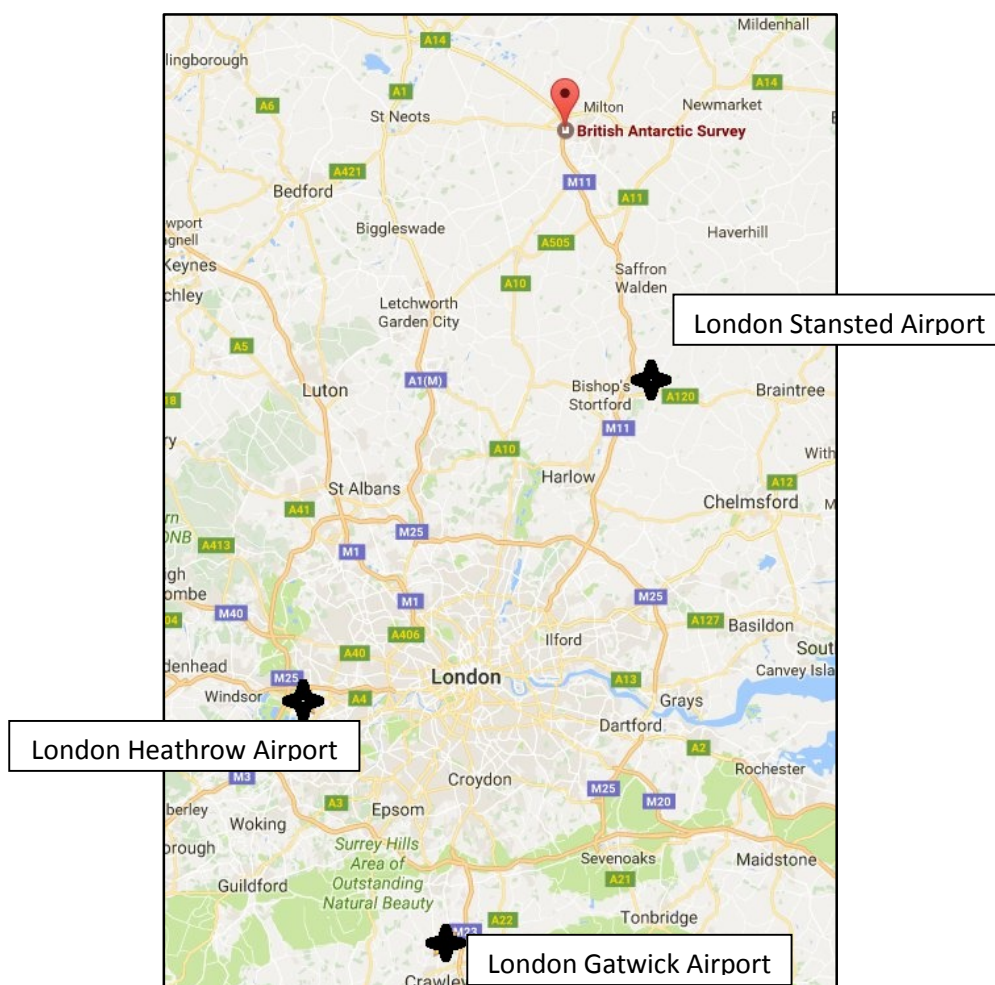
- London Stansted (the closest)
- London Heathrow
- London Gatwick (the furthest away).

From **London Heathrow**, the London Underground Piccadilly Line connects to Kings Cross Station and trains to Cambridge.

From **London Gatwick**, frequent “Thameslink” services run from the airport to London St Pancras, which is five minutes’ walk from Kings Cross Station. This gives a much quicker connection to Cambridge than the coach service.

From **London Stansted**, Cambridge can be easily reached by rail, coach or taxi:

- there is a direct train to Cambridge, which takes 35 minutes and costs around £10 one way;
- there are National Express coach services to Cambridge from all three airports and a one way ticket costs around £10 - £30 (www.nationalexpress.com)
- a taxi from London Stansted Airport to BAS will take around 40 minutes.
